Edward Dawson Ives (1925-2009; renowned folklorist)
Edward Riley Ives (1839-1918; toymaker; established the Ives Manufacturing Company)
Frederick Eugene Ives (1856-1937; invented half-tone photoengraving, pioneer of color photography)
George Homer Ives (1835-1863; road agent hanged in Nevada City, Montana, 21 December 1863)
Henry Ives (tailor and developer of Ives Seedling grape ca. 1844)
Herbert Eugene Ives (1882-1953; optical physicist and enemy of Einstein and his work)
Icle Ivanhoe Ives (1909-1995; folk singer, more popularly known as 'Burl Ives')
James Merritt Ives (1824-1895; printmaker and partner of Nathaniel Currier)
Joseph Christmas Ives (1828-1868; soldier, botanist, explorer of the Colorado River in 1858)
William Ives (1607-1648; lineage progenitor)
